

WorldTeach is a non-profit, non-governmental organization that provides opportunities for individuals to make a meaningful contribution to international education by living and working as volunteer teachers in developing countries. Based at the Center for International Development at Harvard University, WorldTeach offers the benefits of a well-established volunteer organization, while also providing more comprehensive, personalized support and training as an NGO. In each of our programs, volunteers are placed in schools and host communities in developing countries that specifically request WorldTeach volunteers and would otherwise be unable to afford or locate qualified teachers. Volunteers receive training, language preparation, and field support, empowering them to make an impact that will last long after they leave. Over the past 20 years, WorldTeach has placed over 4000 volunteers in 28 countries.

WorldTeach offers both year-long and summer teaching opportunities in Africa:

Since 1989, WorldTeach volunteers have been teaching English, math, science and computer skills in rural communities throughout [Namibia](#).

In 2008, WorldTeach is offering new programs in both [Rwanda](#) and [Kenya](#). In Rwanda, volunteers will be teaching English, math and science in public high schools in and around Kigali, the country's capital. Volunteers in Kenya will be teaching and living in Nyumbani village, a village created to house and care for orphaned children who have lost both of their parents to AIDS.

WorldTeach has been sending summer volunteers to [South Africa](#) to teach computer courses, English literacy, and math to children and adults in the township of Masiphumelele since 2005. We are beginning a year-long program in the Western Cape Province in 2009!
