Michael Hoffman is a co-founder of Palamon Capital Partners in 1999 and a Chairman and a member of the Operating Committee. He is an American/Austrian national and is fluent in German and Dutch. Mr Hoffman has extensive experience in private equity, built up over the past twenty years. Before founding Palamon, Mr Hoffman was with Warburg Pincus for eleven years, having established the firm's London office in 1987. Prior to joining Warburg Pincus, Mr Hoffman had a fifteen-year career as a management consultant with McKinsey & Co, Arthur D. Little, and Booz, Allen & Hamilton.

Mr. Hoffman received a BA cum laude from the University of Texas, an MA in international affairs from Columbia University, and an MBA from Harvard University. He served for nine years as Chairman of the Advisory Board of the Columbia University School of International and Public Affairs and is currently a member of the International Advisory Board of the University. Mr Hoffman is a Director of the United States-Spain Council, the Salzburg Seminar, and is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. He serves on the Boards of a number of performing arts organisations, including as a Governor of the Royal Shakespeare Company and as a Trustee of the Almeida Theatre in London.
