LEADING WITH IMPACT Skills for Complex Challenges

EXECUTIVE EDUCATION

Overview

In today's interconnected world, leaders face a number of global crises, disasters, and funding constraints. Leading with Impact equips participants with the practical frameworks and tools of strategic communications, crisis management, political strategy, conflict mitigation, and collaboration to prepare for, adapt to, and manage these complex challenges.

Course Objectives

This two day intensive course offers a unique opportunity for mid-and seniorlevel leaders from government, as well as from the private and non-profit sectors, to gain an in-depth understanding of complex organizational challenges and opportunities. Participants will learn and develop their professional skills in crisis leadership, effective negotiations, strategic communications, critical decision-making, risk management, cross-sector collaboration, and policy influencing.

The program will enhance participants' ability to appreciate the complexity of managing large-scale and extreme events, not only from an operational viewpoint but also from an interagency and strategic perspective.

Professional Benefits and Skills

Cross-Sector Collaboration – Develop effective organizational partnerships across sectors through interactive exercises to evaluate collaborative impact.

Crisis Leadership – Examine human performance in a crisis and how leaders influence others to adapt to extreme events in an interconnected world.

Effective Negotiation – Improve negotiation skills by learning and practicing a five-point negotiation framework that turns emotional obstacles into assets.

Skillful Communication – Identify core messages to communicate to various audiences and practice delivering them in challenging circumstances.



Policy Influencing – Learn how to influence policy discussions and decisionmakers for complex challenges.



Managing Extreme Events – Discover how organizations manage risk and prepare for dealing with novelty for greater resilience.
