## I. INTRODUCTION

The goal of the collaborating efforts of the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) and this Columbia University Capstone Project was to support OHCHR to expand its partnerships with relevant human rights education and training (HRET) stakeholders that deliver methodologically-sound HRET programmes at global and regional levels, particularly those engaging with youth. This project:

1. Catalogues and maps existing non-governmental organisations (NGOs) and academic institutions with human rights education-related goals and programming that especially target youth, particularly focusing on ages 15-24. The two main categories are:
  - a. Institutions that perform HRET without defining programmes as such,
  - b. Institutions that have either a human rights mission or embody human rights values, and are poised to establish HRET programmes;
2. Analyzes the trends, gaps, and opportunities of the newly mapped organisations;
3. Recommends regionally and globally active stakeholders to consider for partnership with OHCHR that are equipped to implement methodologically-sound HRET programming.<sup>1</sup>

## II. CONTEXT AND METHODOLOGY OF THE HRET MAPPING

Before launching our global investigation of institutions that fit the United Nations' (UN) criteria for partnership, our team established the following parameters and qualifications to best tailor the research to meet the client's specific requests:

Parameters of the study: Based on requirements from the client's Terms of Reference, our group defined three types of organisations that match the client's objective of finding useful partner institutions for human rights education youth programming. Our team divided the three types of organisations we found into "Tiers" sorted by explicit relevance to the objective:

Tier 1: Performs HRET without defining its programmes as such. For example, an organisation may teach youth about their right to education and how to advocate for that right, but they do not refer to this programming as "human rights education." The existing OHCHR database already captures organisations performing HRET and explicitly calling it as such; however, there are a large number of organisations that perform HRET without so identifying their programs. These organisations were captured in Tier 1.

Tier 2: Has a human rights mission and does not perform HRET. For example, an organisation might have a mission focused on securing human rights for all human beings, have programming in which they advocate for youths' rights, and have a broad reach with offices throughout a region, but they do not yet engage in human

rights education programming. In capturing the full scope of opportunity for partnership to expand HRET globally, it was important to capture the organisations that do not yet perform HRET, but have an explicit human rights mission, the capacity to quickly expand into HRET, and would benefit greatly from partnering with OHCHR because of the additional resources, insights, and institutional capacity the office would provide. These organisations were captured in Tier 2.

Tier 3: Has human rights values and does not perform HRET. For example, an organisation may have a mission that focuses on treating all human beings with respect and dignity, as well as programming that discusses basic tenets of respect, leadership, and advocacy, but at no point explicitly refers to human rights. Similar to Tier 2, these organisations have all of the necessary characteristics for partnership with OHCHR to expand HRET globally without yet having any HRET programming. While Tier 2 organisations have an explicit human rights mission, organisations that have a mission that embodies human rights values without directly stating it as such were captured in Tier 3.

Qualifications: In order to qualify for our catalogue, organisations required:

1. No presence within the OHCHR online HRET database (Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, 2019).
2. An online presence via a website or Facebook page,
3. No explicit referencing of their programming as HRET, and
4. Recent activity articulated in publication and social media postings or website copyright information.

To standardise our team's search for organisations, we selected the World Association of Non-Governmental Organisations (WANGO) and their online "World NGO Directory" to ensure consistency within our search (World Association of Non-Governmental Organisations, 2019). We selected this database as an alternative to Google searches and other directories, because we found that WANGO provided a credible, comprehensive, and exhaustive archive of institutions for purposive sampling. Furthermore, our team determined that by inputting "human rights" into WANGO's "area of focus" search function, we could populate regional lists of potential institutions that could fit within the three tiers.

Our next step consisted of dividing the world into six regions based on the OHCHR's regional classifications listed on their website and matching them to WANGO's regional categories (Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, 2019). Per Figure 1, we used Northern America, Latin America and the Caribbean, Europe and Central Asia, Asia-Pacific, Sub-Saharan Africa, and the Middle East and North Africa for our research, which allowed us to match the OHCHR. Our distribution included the following provided below in Figure 1:

Once our team had established a clear idea of what types of institutions were within our purview and qualified for the study, and after selecting the WANGO database and internally dividing the research labor regionally among ourselves, we developed a Google Form to input data for each institution. One Google Form was completed for each institution and its programming, automatically populating a Google Sheet spreadsheet with all of the information collected. Our form included the following data inputs, shown in Figure 2:

  - j. Regions active: Northern America, Latin America and the Caribbean, Sub-Saharan Africa, Middle East and North Africa, Asia-Pacific, Europe and Central Asia
3. Programme information: Up to five programme inputs available per institution (limited the tracking of programmes to those directly related to education work, with not more than five per organisation)
  - a. Programme name

- b. Programme objective
- c. Programme type: Summer School, Distance Education/Online Programme, Training Programme, Funding Opportunities, Short Courses, After School Programme, Formal Education, Non-Formal Education (Human Rights Council, 2017),<sup>2</sup> Other
- d. Programme youth target: ages 15-24 UN Definition (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, 2019),<sup>3</sup> includes younger than 15-24, includes older than 15-24, includes younger and older than 15-24, no age range given, other
- e. Programme target audience
- f. Programme methodologies: Presentation and discussion, Panel discussion, Working groups, Case studies, Problem-solving/brainstorming, Simulation/role-playing, Field Trips, Practical exercises, Round-table discussions, Visual aids, Study abroad/foreign exchange, Lecture, Other
- g. Programme content description
- 4. Institutional engagement
  - a. Tier classification: Tier 1, Tier 2, or Tier 3
  - b. Transparency indicators
    - i. Financial transparency: Minimal to No Records 1, Partial Records 2, Up to Date 3
    - ii. Board transparency: No Information 1, Partial Information 2, Full Information 3
    - iii. Personnel transparency: No Information 1, Partial Information 2, Full Information 3

These categories were chosen to provide key information about institutions and their programmes to the UN. Due to time constraints and limited labor availability, some categories were omitted from the form to capture as many organisations as possible. The omitted data included detailed programme information, contact information, and listing partner organisations.

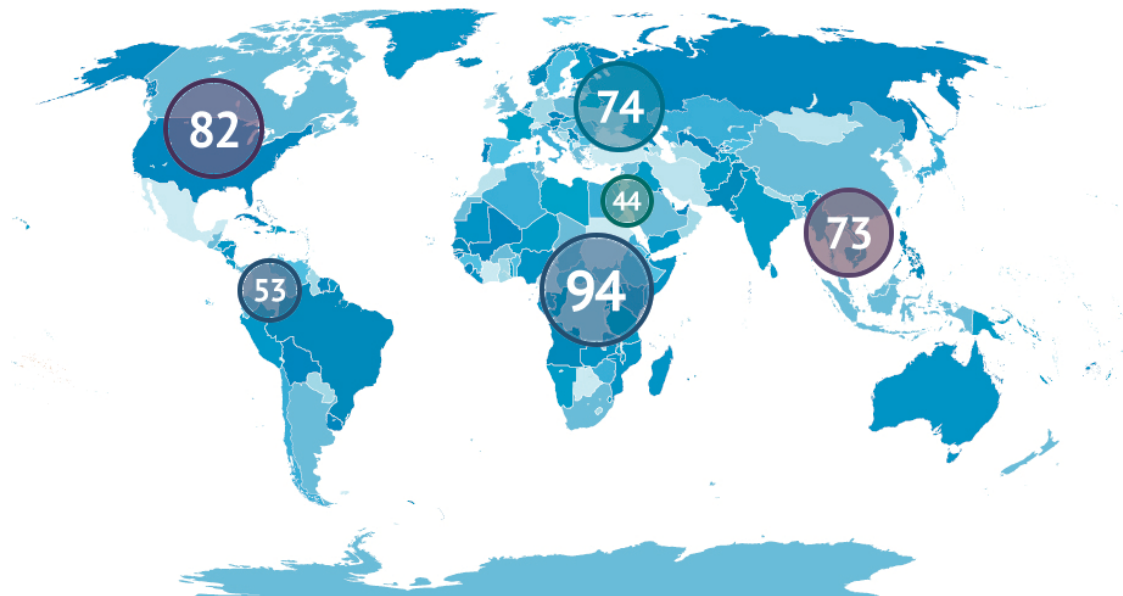

### III. FINDINGS AND ANALYSIS

#### A. Global Findings

A total of 142 organisations were newly mapped, with many active in multiple regions. 19 organisations were active in all six regions. Sub-Saharan Africa had the most active with 94 organisations, followed by 83 in Northern America, 74 in Europe and Central Asia, 74 in the Asia-Pacific, 53 in Latin America and the Caribbean, and 44 in Middle East North Africa (MENA). The breakdown is illustrated in Figure 3 below:

**Figure 3.** Institutional Mapping by Regions Active



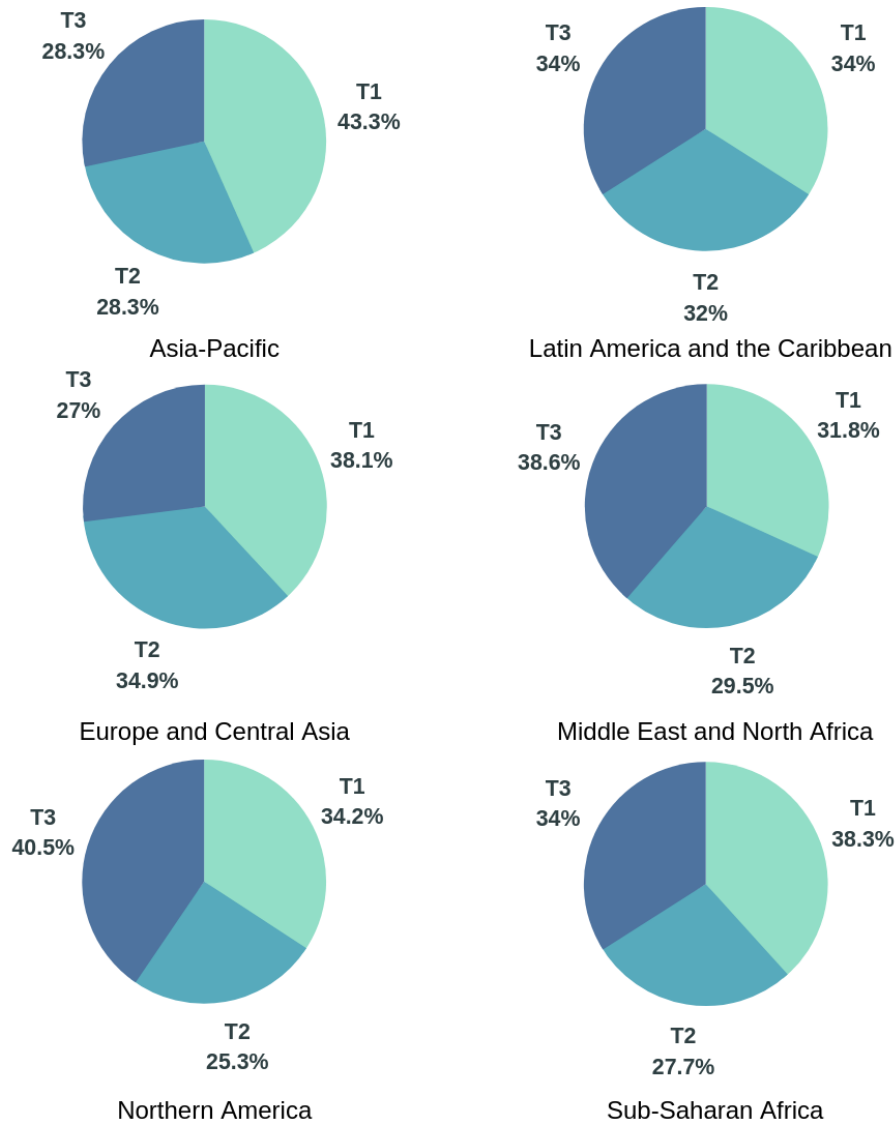
A number of trends were consistent across the regions. For all regions, NGOs were the most common institution type, followed by education and training centres, then either community organisations or networks as the third most common. To clarify further, network organisations are collections of NGOs that behave as a single entity for coordination and expanded reach. As for programme type, the top three for all regions were training programmes, non-formal education, and formal education. Lastly, the most common programme methodology were practical exercises, followed by working groups or presentation and discussion, depending on the region.

## B. Regional Findings

We identified key regional trends to highlight, exemplifying the type of data collected for each institution.

Tier types: The Asia-Pacific region had the highest concentration of Tier 1 organisations relative to the other regions. Europe had the greatest concentration of Tier 2 organisations relative to other regions, while Northern America had the highest concentration of Tier 3 organisations relative to other regions.

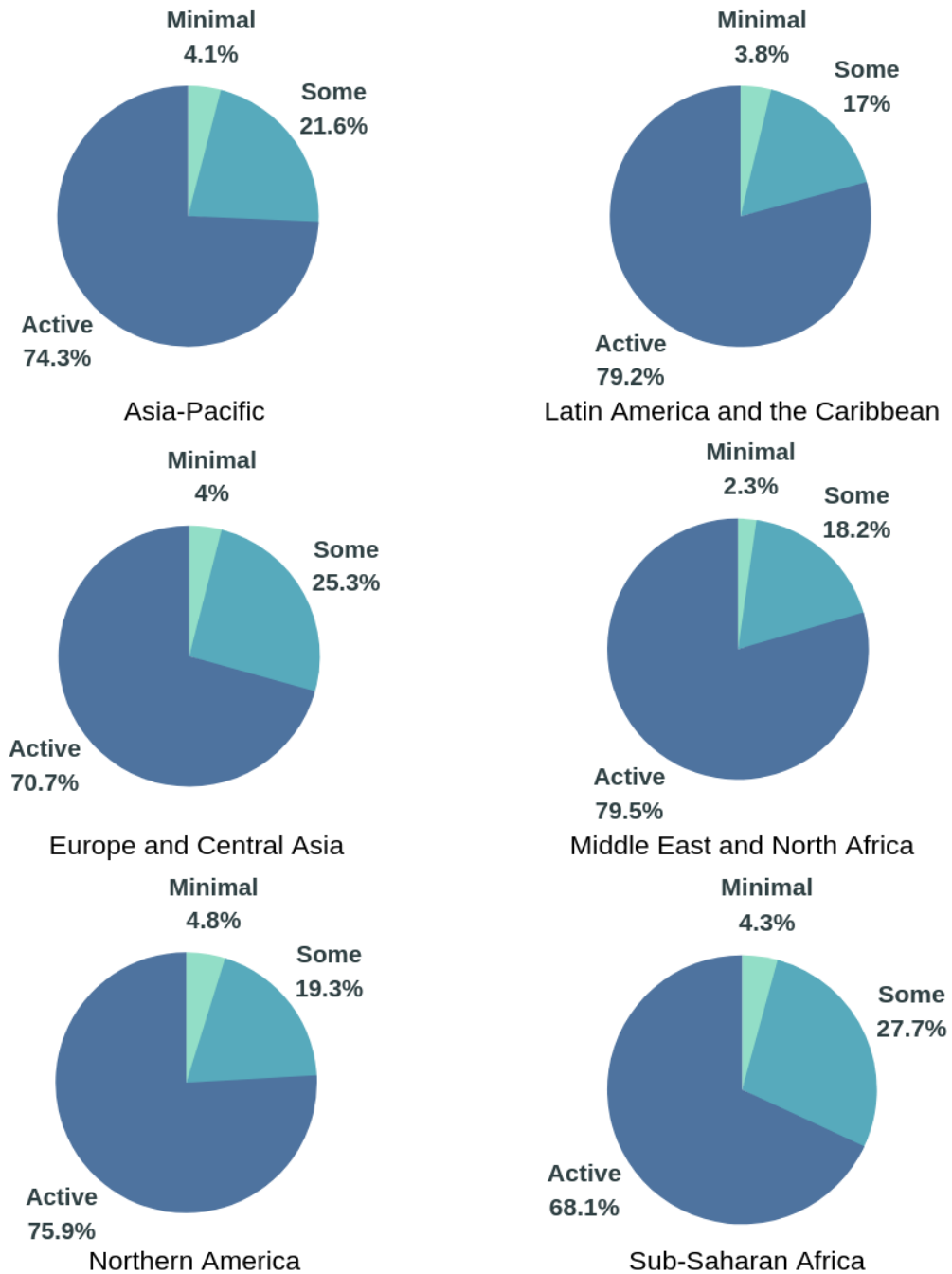
**Figure 4. Tier Types**

 T3: Tier 3 – Has human rights values and does not perform HRET

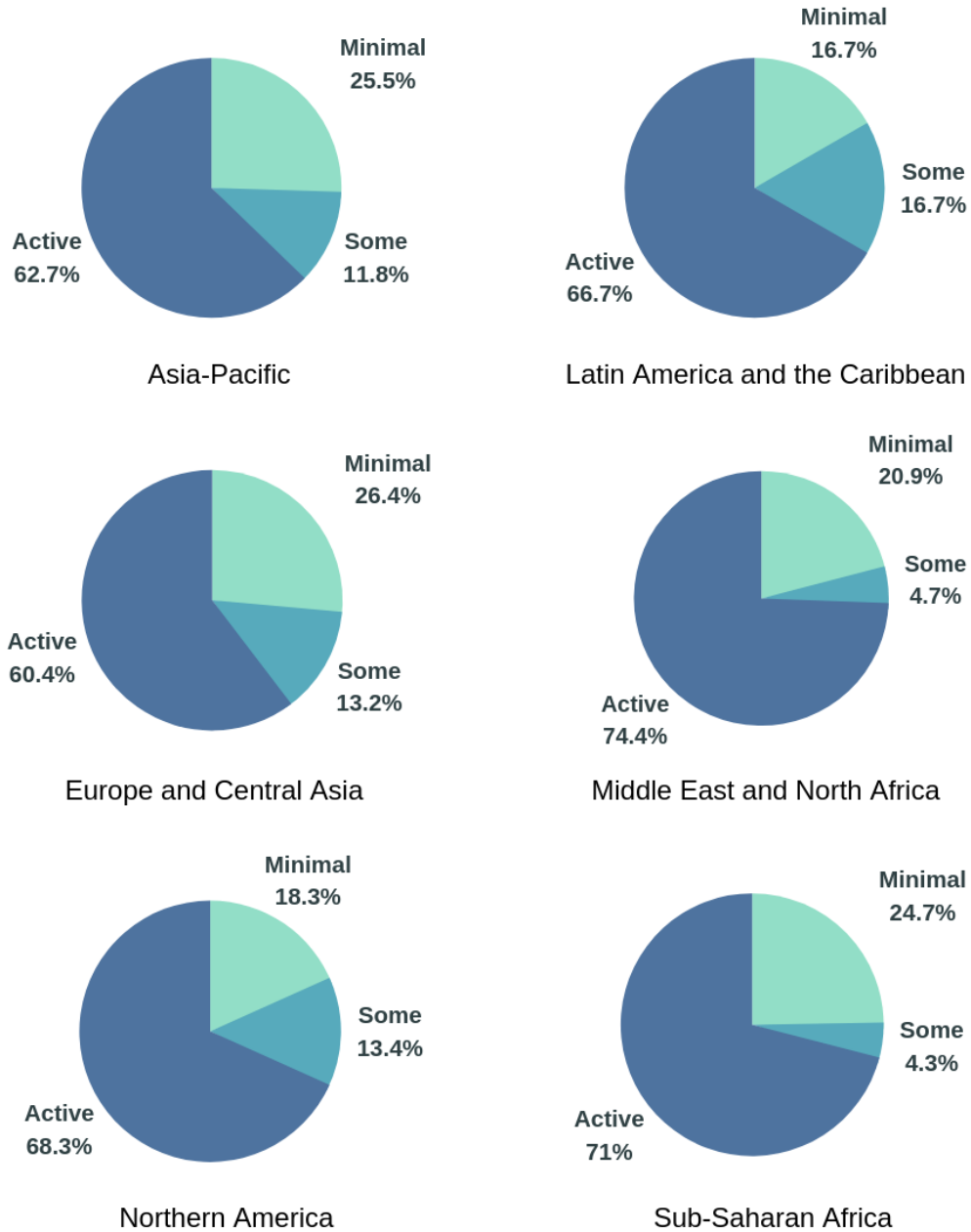
Programming: The level of active programming was evaluated based on the recency and volume of programming for the institutions, with active programming meaning it was central and functioning over the past several years. Institutions that did not explicitly list programmes on their website were excluded from this analysis. The MENA region had the most active programming, while Sub-Saharan Africa had the least.

**Figure 5. Programming**



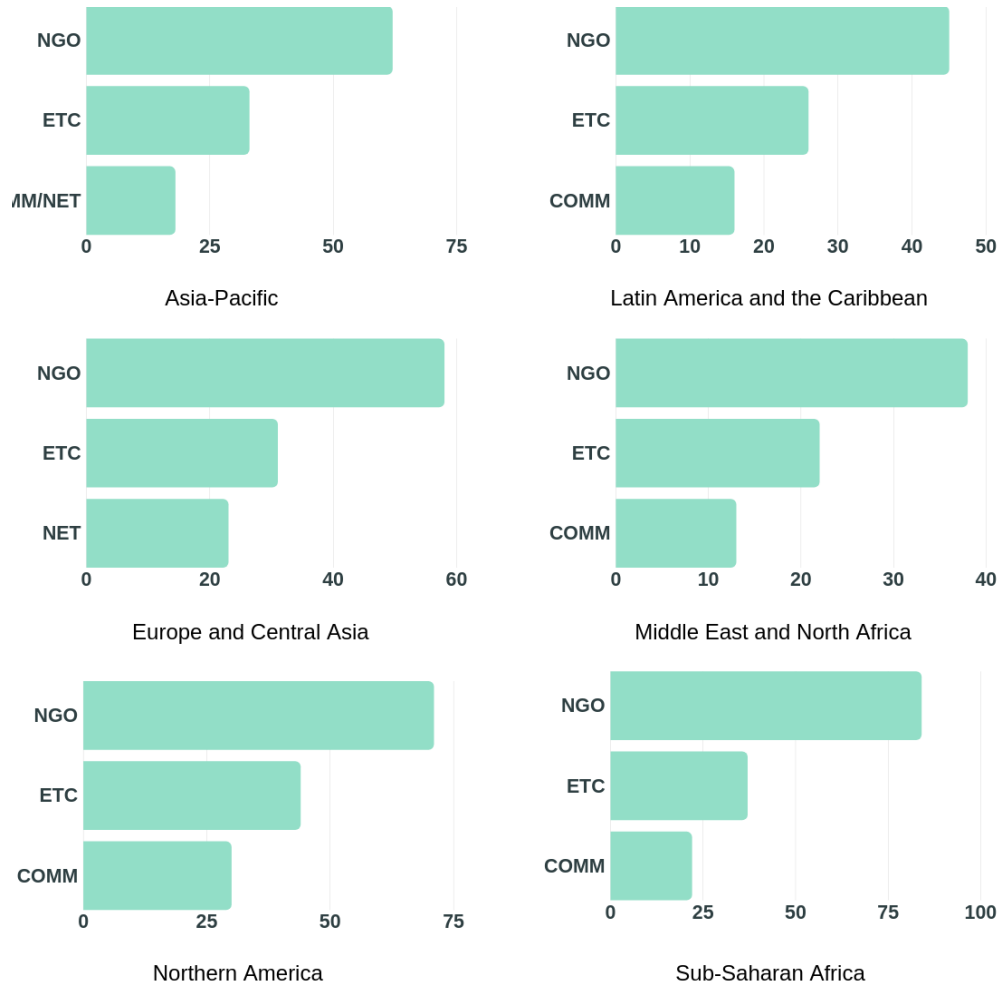
Social media: Social media was one of the indicators used to gauge the level of engagement of the institutions, based on breadth of content that was shared and the frequency of use. Other indicators included the level of activity through publications and annual reports. The MENA region had the most with active social media, while Asia-Pacific had the least.

Institution types: The most common institution types were fairly consistent across the regions, with non-government organisations and education and training centres being the top two, respectively. The third most common was either network or community organisation, depending on the region.

## C. Region Profiles

1. Sub-Saharan Africa: Of all organisations mapped in the region, about 38% were classified as Tier 1, followed by Tier 3 (34%) and Tier 2 (28%). In this region, there were a multitude of community and grassroots organisations that held a wider focus on direct services rather than policy alone.

Most organisations operated across various countries, but remained limited to their region exclusively. This region had the least amount of demonstrable, active programming according to their websites, as just 68.1% of organisations catalogued and routinely updated programmatic information on their websites. However, their existing programmes held a practical focus on solving the region's specific issues, including unemployment, food insecurity, drought and famine, and limited access to early childhood and primary education. As a result, programmes commonly utilised problem-solving or brainstorming techniques. 71% of organisations employed social media, including Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram, to engage with youth, making this region the second highest user of social media across all regions.

2. Asia-Pacific: Throughout Asia-Pacific, many organisations operated on a national scale, though they did succeed in covering large geographical areas. Though we did not map such organisations, it remained important to highlight a unique trend that was specific to this region. Asia-Pacific held the highest ratio of Tier 1 organisations at 43.3%. Tier 2 and 3 organisations were tied at 28.3%.

Asia-Pacific's organisations had active programming at about 74% and routinely updated their social media accounts. The presence of networks as the third most common institution type made this region similar to Europe and Central Asia, but distinct from all other regions, which showed community organisations as their third most common institution type.

3. Europe and Central Asia: As mentioned above, Europe and Central Asia's third most common institution type, networks, differed from most of the other regions. This may be common to Europe because of the high concentration of organisations operating in human rights generally, and HRET more specifically. These organisations leveraged their resources, which were great relative to other regions, to create far-reaching connections and share expertise globally. Most organisations in the region were classified as Tier 1 at 38% followed by Tier 2 organisations at almost 35%. At 27%, this region had the lowest amount of Tier 3 organisations across all regions.

Throughout Europe and Central Asia, organisations were well connected to other regions and used their ample resources to deepen relations. They were also quite transparent with their financial and programme information. Additionally, they maintained a strong focus on cultivating an interactive online presence. This was reflected in organisations' social media engagement, which was roughly 60%. Further, among the organisations captured in the region, 70.7% had active

programming, again, meaning it was central and functioning over the past several years. Finally, organisations generally implemented programming that allowed them to provide expertise to other regions, instead of remaining in Europe. Based on our research, this seemed to be the result of the network system of community practitioners, which emphasised the high prevalence of cross-regional connections between Europe and the rest of the world.

4. Latin America and the Caribbean: In Latin America and the Caribbean, Tier 1 and Tier 3 organisations tied at 34% in terms of presence in this region, followed closely by Tier 2 organisations at 32%. While we did not map national organisations, it remained important to note that most nationally operating organisations in this region did reach a large number of individuals.

The majority of organisations in this region held active programming at roughly 79%. Qualitatively, many organisations in the region emphasised strong religious themes, while others supported foreign exchange, international conferences, and sports as avenues to youth empowerment. In this region, organisations often utilised working groups and presentation/problem-solving techniques to enrich their programmes. Social media platforms, such as Facebook and Instagram, were also routinely active and often provided more timely and accurate information than their websites.

5. Middle East and North Africa (MENA): Organisations that were officially and operationally active in the Middle East and North Africa tended to be headquartered in other countries. In fact, 86% of organisations doing work in this region had their headquarters in Northern America and Europe. This was a major trend that separated MENA from other regions, where community-based organisations generally organised on their own terms. Tier 3 organisations were the most prominent organisation type in the MENA region at 38.6%, followed by Tier 1 (31.8%) and Tier 2 (29.5%) organisations. Social media engagement throughout organisations in the region was also extremely high.

Perhaps because of the institutional reach of the international NGOs working in the region, the strength of engagement and level of programming in-country were the most active when compared to other regions at a dominating 79.5%. For organisations that listed their programming, we found that the most common types were non-formal education, training programmes, and funding opportunities (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, 2019).<sup>4</sup> For organisations that did not have specific programmes listed on their website, we found a wide range of methodologies, including practical exercises, lectures and working groups. For institutions that did list sets of programmes, the most common methodologies offered were lectures, practical exercises, problem-solving/brainstorming, and working groups.

6. Northern America: There were more organisations in this study with headquarters in the United States than any other individual country, with the majority of headquarter offices located in New York City and Washington, D.C. This concentration suggested a potential strategy by human rights agencies to establish physical proximity to political bodies like the United States Congress and the UN, as well as the donor community.

Regarding the tier distribution of institutions, Northern America had the largest regional share of Tier 3 organisations at 40.5%, and the lowest regional share of Tier 2 organisations at 25.3%. This means that institutions active in the United States and Canada tended to predominantly publicise human rights values like independence, dignity, and equality (Tier 3), without having a mission statement that explicitly mentions human rights (Tier 2). 34.2% of the organisations in Northern America qualified as Tier 1, a percentage similar to all of the other regions except Asia-Pacific which had 43.3%.

83% of organisations active in Northern America advertised programmes online related to human rights, education, and youth. Of these advertised programmes, the most common programme types included training programmes, non-formal education, formal education, and funding opportunities. The most common methodologies were practical exercises, working groups, presentations and discussions, as well as problem-solving and brainstorming.

#### IV. CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES

Due to time and resource constraints, identifying specific regional organisations that demonstrated sound practices and promoted HRET without explicitly calling it that posed some challenges to our analysis of regional and global patterns. With each of us focusing on researching different regions of the world, we were aware that our personal biases could prevent us from being objective in our assessments of an organisation's health or fitness. While we created guidelines for our analysis, assumptions could have led to some bias capture. Additionally, the cross-regional nature of many of the organisations identified resulted in a blending of assessments, making it more difficult to distill individual variation. We also immediately began to notice variation across regions: for example, because India is so large, many of the organisations doing HRET are nationally-based, as opposed to having regional programming.

For these reasons, in our attempt to assess these types of organisations, we created methodologies for identifying different strengths or weaknesses, particularly in the area of organisational health. We also tiered organisations based on whether or not they had human rights education at the forefront, human rights in their mission, or human rights in their values. Still, we found that in preparing our recommendations for partnership with the client, it was beneficial to use the collective experience we gained from our research to make additional recommendations that went beyond our metrics.

Our knowledge gained through the process of developing our methodology, researching institutions, maintaining team communication about our progress, and speaking with the

client all contributed to our ability to make appropriate and specific recommendations for partnership with OHCHR.

## V. CONCLUDING OBSERVATIONS

In creating a report of the existing opportunities for partnership in HRET globally, several strategies were necessary to begin to capture the full scope, while also building a detailed picture necessary for analysis and action steps. A helpful first step was determining the exact scope of the mandate, looking for organisations that were not explicitly performing HRET, as is currently captured in the existing OHCHR database. We were then faced with several decisions that allowed for the best utilisation of five researchers with diverse skills and focuses. Dividing the world regionally, while also having two meetings per week, allowed for both specialization and a cross-pollination of knowledge among the team. This specialization allowed for the capture of the necessary knowledge to identify regional trends, while the constant sharing of information allowed for a comparison across regions and provided the basis for global analysis.

The foundation of the research project was the necessary division of labor, while maintaining constant streams of communication, both within the team and with OHCHR. While it would be impossible to say the information provided currently represents all possible opportunities for HRET globally, it provides the basis from which additional research can be done, including finding active partner organisations, consistent funding sources, and regions both open to and needing HRET. Our findings underscore the importance of recognizing regional differences, while also remembering the several global trends that underpin HRET. Each region is prepared for the introduction and teaching of human rights, but they are surely at different stages of development in the field of HRET, and require different programme types, methodologies, and focus areas. The mapping report annex offers a snapshot of nearly 150 organisations that are prepared to take HRET more broadly and deeply in each region, providing the diversity of programme and thought leadership necessary to be effective globally.

## VI. MAPPING REPORT ANNEX

The following organisations fill gaps in the OHCHR's current mapping<sup>5</sup> of existing global and regional human rights education and training initiatives and institutions. Instead of capturing organisations that operate and market HRET programming, as the existing database does, this comprehensive list includes organisations that either perform HRET without calling it as such (Tier 1), have an explicit human rights mission (Tier 2), or have human rights values (Tier 3) that make them ripe for expansion in HRET.
